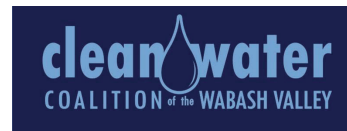

## Why should you come?

**MS4 personnel** are responsible for plan review, inspection, and enforcement. This workshop provides an opportunity to satisfy the Rule 13 training requirements.

**Contractors** are required to provide trained individuals for erosion and sediment control. According to 327 IAC 15-5-4, a trained individual is an individual who is trained and experienced in the principles of storm water quality, including erosion and sediment control as may be demonstrated by state registration, professional certification, experience, or completion of course-

work that enable the individual to make judgments regarding storm water control or treatment monitoring. This workshop will help individuals gain a better understanding of the importance of proper storm water quality procedures and techniques.

This workshop will also provide developers, contractors, inspectors, and builders an update on the state of storm water regulatory expectations in Indiana. You will also learn the requirements for all of the regulated storm water areas and learn what is needed to maintain compliance with local regulations regarding storm water run-off and

erosion control.

IDEM staff members will be informing attendees about topics such as 401/404 permitting, Rule 5, and Rule 13. By increasing awareness of common violations, they hope to improve compliance with state regulations.

Additionally, MS4 personnel, IDEM staff, and SWCD staff will be available all day to answer any questions you may have.
